#### WCSO: Chipley probation officer threated victim

**STAFF REPORT** 

A Washington County probation officer was arrested on felony charges of unlawfully and intentionally threatening a victim.

Washington County Sheriff's Office arrested 47-yearold Laura Lee Cates of Sunny Hills Thursday, August 31.

Cates is an employee with the Florida Department of Corrections Probation and Parole Office in Chipley.

According to a WCSO press release, reports allege an incident occurred on August 30 between Cates and a victim of a pending felony court case. The victim stated Cates told them if they did not accept the plea deal in the case, Cates would file criminal charges against the victim in an unrelated incident, which according to WCSO, does not exist to their knowledge.

Cates is charged with unlawfully and intentionally threatening a victim to file criminal charges against them to persuade this person who is a victim of a second-degree felony case for a lighter plea deal for the defendant.

'I will not tolerate a victim of any criminal case to be threatened or intimidated," said Sheriff Kevin Crews.

Hurricane Idalia made landfall in Taylor County last Wednesday as a Category 3 storm. While residents in Holmes and Washington counties are no doubt relieved they avoided the worst of the storm, they weren't going to let their fellow Floridians handle preparation and recovery

Hundreds of linemen converged at a processing station established by Florida Power and Light at Phillip Rountree Stadium in Chipley the day before the storm made landfall, and members of the Florida National Guard were deployed to help ahead of the storm's landfall.

The Florida State Guard - which was reactivated in 2022 after decades of dormancy - also sprang into action, feeding residents in

hard-hit communities during recovery efforts.

Several local organizations are also coming together to help in recovery and comfort.

The Holmes County Sheriff's Office, Chamber of Commerce, Council on Aging, School Financial Services, and Doctors Memorial Hospital have collaborated to hold a supply drive to collect items like non-perishable foods, toiletries, water, batteries, to distribute to those impacted.

### Judge rules redistricting plan unconstitutional

TALLAHASSEE — A Leon County circuit judge Saturday ruled that a congressional redistricting plan violated the Florida Constitution and needs to be redrawn.

Circuit Judge J. Lee Marsh sided with voting-rights groups in a lawsuit focused on a North Florida district that in the past elected Black Democrat Al Lawson but was dramatically revamped during the 2022 redistricting process.

While the case initially addressed other districts, attorneys for the plaintiffs and the state last month agreed to narrow it to Congressional District 5. In the agreement, the state acknowledged that "if the non-diminishment standard applies to North Florida, then there is no Black-performing district in North Florida under the enacted map."

But the state maintained "that the Equal Protection Clause would nonetheless prohibit the creation of a Black-performing district in North Florida.'

A Washington County man suffered severe bite wounds from a dog attack on August 24, according to law enforcement reports. Several others were also bitten by the same dog throughout the course of events that developed before deputies with the Washington County Sheriff's Office responded to the call.

## Summer squash in every skillet

"Summer was everything good to eat... a thousand colors in a parched landscape...

"-Harper Lee As summer marches toward fall, we here in the South are still experiencing rather hot weather, most days. It does get tiresome. but I try to look on the bright side: Flowers are still blooming and vegetable gardens are still producing.

One of my favorite garden vegetables to eat this time of year is yellow crookneck squash, or as some of us commonly refer to it, summer squash. It has a mildly sweet flavor and tender texture that make it a welcome addition to my summertime recipe rotation.

I visited a local farm stand on Saturday, and happily purchased some green tomatoes, ripe tomatoes, and yellow squash, among other things, to take home for supper. In my excitement to cook with the fresh local produce, I pulled out one of my favorites from my cookbook collection, looking specifically for a new way to use yellow squash that I haven't tried yet.

#### Summer squash with tomato-ricotta filling

#### **Ingredients:**

4 small-to-medium-sized yellow squash (or zucchini, if you prefer)

1 cup chopped fresh mushrooms 1 cup diced peeled green tomato (if on hand) 1 1/2 cups torn collard green leaves 1 teaspoon to 1 tablespoon hot sauce, or to taste 1 clove garlic, minced 1/4 cup part skim ricotta cheese 1/4 cup shaved Parmesan cheese

#### **Method:**

- 1. Wash the whole squashes, then cut off each end
- 2. Place the squash in a colander over a pot of simmering water, and cover (or use a double boiler). Steam them for 15 minutes, then carefully remove to a cutting board.
- 3. When cool enough to handle, slice them in half lengthwise, and scrape out seeds. Scrape out any flesh left after scraping the seeds out into a small mixing bowl, and set it aside.
  - 4. You should now have "squash boats."
- 5. Put a tablespoon of olive oil into a skillet over medium-high heat. When hot, add the mushrooms, tomato, collard greens, garlic, and any squash flesh you scraped out of the halves, and begin to stir.
  - 6. Sauté for five minutes, adding 1/4 cup water if mixture seems too dry.
  - 7. Add hot sauce. Stir another two minutes, then remove mixture to a mixing bowl.
- 8. Add the ricotta and Parmesan to the sautéed vegetables. Fold together, making sure the vegetables are gently but thoroughly incorporated into the cheeses.
  - 9. Taste for saltiness; add some, if needed. (Typically, the cheese lends enough salt to these fillings.)
- 10. Add the filling back into the squash halves, then place them in a baking dish that you've sprayed with cooking spray.
- 11. Sprinkle with more Parmesan, and then bake at 350 degrees for 15 to 20 minutes, not allowing the filling to become too dry.

Serve as a wonderfully tasty side dish alongside your favorite grilled meat all summer long.





#### 8 things to know about Florida's wildlife management system

If you have hunted a wildlife management area or are wildlife viewing, paddling, public hunting areas, under- and camping. stand how these hunting opportunities are managed and WMAs offer a variety of hunting contribute to the process for developing hunting-related rules for WMAs.

#### Most WMAs are owned or managed by entities other than the **FWC**

The majority of Florida's 6-million-acre WMA system is managed or owned by government agencies or private landowners the FWC has partnered with. The FWC is the lead manager or landowner for 1.46 million acres and works with cooperators to allow hunting and other outdoor recreation on another 4.54 million acres. WMAs are managed for conservation and recreation and provide a diversity of habitats managed for wildlife.

#### WMAs are for everyone

There are over 184 areas across the state in the WMA system, from Perdido River WMA in northwest Florida to Southern Glades WEA in the south region and all points in between. These areas are managed to conserve a variety of wildlife species and provide outdoor recreation opportunities. Certainly, hunting is a mainstay on Florida's WMA

system and offered at the seasons. vast majority of areas. These public areas also provide opportunities for fishing,

#### opportunities

Hunters can choose from quota hunts, special-opportunity hunts and public hunting areas where a quota permit is not required to hunt. Depending on the WMA and time of year, hunters can pursue deer, turkey, waterfowl, wild hogs, dove, quail, gray squirrels and more. The FWC also issues permits for hunting on several U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service national wildlife refuges in Florida (but does not manage those hunts).

#### Florida's Quota Hunt Program serves multiple purposes

Quotas, which are the maximum number of hunters permitted to hunt on a WMA during a given period of time, provide hunters with quality hunting experiences. In addition to managing game populations, quotas are used to prevent overcrowding on WMAs that are smaller or in high demand.

The number of quota permits available for each area is based on an area's size, habitat, game populations and hunter preference, and draw lotteries throughout the

Quota permits also allow the FWC to offer hunts to a broad range of users. Quota permits are issued at unless exempt from license requirements, applicants must have a valid Florida management area permit (or license that includes a management area permit) to apply.

#### Special-opportunity hunts are...

These hunts are designed to provide high quality public hunting experiences through large tracts of land, low hunter quotas and abundant populations of deer, wild turkeys and wild hogs.

Hunters can submit as many applications for specialopportunity hunts as they want. In fact, many hunters submit several applications to increase their chances of being awarded a permit via random draw. There is a \$5 non-refundable application fee that must be submitted with each individual application. Permit fees range from \$50 to \$175 for those awarded a permit through the random drawing.

The public has many opportunities to provide input during the rulemaking procan apply for youth, family cess for WMAs, beginning input prompted the FWC to an extensive review process, stakeholders have several chances to provide input on recommended rule changes.

The FWC reaches out to no cost to hunters; however, hundreds of thousands of stakeholders to make them aware of opportunities to review and comment on rule change proposals through email blasts, the HuntFlorida Facebook page, Twitter, the Hunting Hot Sheet and My-FWC.com. In addition, public testimony opportunities are provided at each Commission meeting after draft rule changes are presented. If the Commission approves the proposed rule amendments for advertising in the Florida Administrative Register, the FWC continues to seek feedback from stakeholders until rule changes are presented for final adoption at a future Commission meeting.

#### search tool were made based on stakeholder feedback

FWC's WMA search tool, WMA Finder, was developed to help users find public hunting opportunities based on location, season, species and type of hunt. WMA Finder also helps users search for part of the WMA rulemaking riding and shooting range

opportunities on our WMA system. Early users of this tool were vital to the software testing process, and their offers a video about Avenza Maps, a free mobile app that lets you track your location in real time on FWC's WMA maps.

#### FWC offers the following tips for a stress-free visit to a WMA

Before you head afield, FWC recommends you carefully review the WMA regulations brochure for the area vou want to hunt because season dates and other rules may vary from statewide seasons and other WMAs.

Also, always check the area's open/closed status to determine its availability to public access and if there are any road closures or updates about check stations or entrances. You can find this information by visiting My-FWC.com and clicking on the red button "WMA Closures and Updates."

WMA regulations bro-Improvements to the WMA chures and maps are only available online and access to WMA regulations brochures is through the WMA Finder only. FWC recommends screenshotting or downloading regulation brochures and area maps as many WMAs have limited internet access.
